The Moonlight Sonata was structurally and stylistically remarkable in its day. Most sonatas of the late 17th and early 18th centuries consisted of a reasonably animated, thematically well-defined first movement, a more-subdued second movement, and a vibrant final movement.

Analysis of the melody of Moonlight Sonata by Ludwig Van Beethoven The melody is introduced in the fifth bar, and must give the idea of floating on the accompaniment. At the tenth bar there comes a change of harmony from the major into the minor key, and here the note G (the first G) in the right hand should be accentuated.

Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata: Quick and Dirty Analysis. First off, what makes the Moonlight Sonata a sonata? In the Classical music era (normally 1750-1825 or so), a "sonata" meant a multi-movement piece for piano solo (like the Moonlight Sonata) or for piano and other instruments.

Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata. The Moonlight Sonata was composed in the summer of 1801 in Hungary, on an estate belonging to the Brunswick family. The composition was published in 1802 and was dedicated to Beethoven's pupil and passion, 17 years old Countess Giulietta Gucciardi. The Sonata is one of the most popular piano sonatas from Beethoven's creation.

The second movement of the Moonlight Sonata is in the form of a scherzo (a comic composition, usually fast-moving and used in the place of a minuet and trio during Beethoven's time). The key of the second movement is D flat major, which is unrelated to the overall key of a c# minor.

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The first movement of Beethoven's sonata "Moonlight" has a triple meter. The movement begins softly with an octave in the left hand and smooth triplets in the right hand. As well, there is dissonance in this piece, the melody played by the right hand, is played against the accompanying triplet rhythm.

In his analysis of the Moonlight sonata, German critic Paul Bekker states that "The opening sonata-allegro movement gave the work a definite character from the beginning... which succeeding movements could supplement but not change. Beethoven rebelled against this determinative quality in the first movement.

In this analysis, we will be examining measures 49-51 of Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata (Opus 27, Number 2, Movement 1). Since we are starting in the middle of the piece, I will reveal the key signature: it is in C# minor. The first half of measure 49 contains G# - B# - D# - F#, a G# dominant seventh chord.

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
