Lewis Brian Jones was buried in his hometown of Cheltenham on July 10th, 1969. The funeral service was held at St Mary's Parish Church and he was buried in Cheltenham Cemetery. Before the funeral, fans had already sent enough flowers to fill the cemetery, including a guitar-shaped arrangement from Brian's family and a huge arrangement spelling out "Gates of Heaven" from The Rolling Stones.
